The 1st NOBIS Young Researchers' Day tries to attract young members of the scientific community, who usually depend on temporary projects and third-party funds. We intend to provide a platform for information exchange and will discuss the problems and possibilities during the early stage of a scientific career. The keynote by Jürgen Herler (Department of Integrative Zoology, University Vienna) will summarize how master and PhD students can be successfully included in research projects, fieldwork and publications.

We encourage especially young scientists (master or PhD level) to send their abstracts and to apply for the new **NOBIS Award** of € **500.-**. This award is a price for an already completed or nearly finished scientific project. Applicants will be invited to present their results and a jury will announce the winner during the meeting.

For the first time, the **NOBIS Grant** of € **3000.-** will be awarded. This grant aims to support an active or planned scientific project. The winner will be designated by the executive board of NOBIS-Austria before the meeting and will be invited to present the project at the NOBIS-Young Researchers' Day.
